



Easy ways to give retirement assets to Girl Scouts Spirit of Nebraska

- Name Girl Scouts Spirit of Nebraska as a beneficiary of all or a portion of your retirement account. The portion donated to Girl Scouts will not be taxed.
- Name your spouse or other heir as primary beneficiary and Girl Scouts Spirit of Nebraska as secondary or contingent beneficiary. Following the death of your loved-one, Girl Scouts Spirit of Nebraska then receives valuable support.
- Designate a specific amount to come to Girl Scouts Spirit of Nebraska first and divide the remainder among your children or heirs. The amount that Girl Scouts receives will not be included in your estate for estate tax purposes.
- Name Girl Scouts Spirit of Nebraska as a beneficiary on a Certificate of Deposit and if you don't need it during your lifetime, it will pass to Girl Scouts Spirit of Nebraska to carry out your philanthropic wishes.
